

Course Description:

This course begins by defining some concepts of Internet function – From how a browser works, to transferring files from your desktop to a server for the world to access. Then, we introduce HTML (the formatting language for web pages). After establishing a common ground with terminology and concepts, participants use basic Dreamweaver features to build a simple project adding text, graphics, links and multiple pages. The course includes solid design direction, as well as technical how-to's.

Prerequisites:

To gain the most from this course, you should:

- Be comfortable working in a Windows or Macintosh environment.
- Have experience using the Internet.
- Have a basic understanding of HTML. (Helpful but not required)

Objectives:

Upon completion of this course participants will be able to:

- Use the fundamental features of Dreamweaver to set up and build a simple online project for your subject, class or school.

- Create and use tables for layout
- Basic Dreamweaver skills: text, images, and links
